A Note From The Director

The Oxford English Dictionary defines the word *almost* as "very nearly but not quite; well-nigh; all but." The very-nearly-but-not-quite town of Almost, Maine is a quiet, strange little place full of characters on the verge of something big: the much-needed closure with an ex, the first fumbling steps of a new relationship, the moment of epiphany.

The show itself lives in this ambiguous space. It's almost a romantic comedy, almost a drama, almost a fantasy; it's almost all three rolled into one, and almost something entirely different.

We exist – as do these characters – in the almost, the suspension between change and staying the same. The northern lights illuminate the sky promising beauty to come, but it's just above our heads, just out of reach. The residents of Almost, Maine go through different tumultuous journeys as they navigate the world of relationships, and they invite us to take that journey with them. We stumble along beside them through sometimes uncomfortable moments of nervousness, joy, despair, and hope, as they find what they are searching for: connection.
