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### From the director:


"I love this place," our Curly told me after rehearsal one night. We'd been discussing the themes of the show, including the character's relationship to nature. "I love that I can swim in my backyard and walk in my woods. I'd never want to live anywhere else."

His words made me pause. I've never seen the winds sweeping down the plains of Oklahoma, but when Curly sings that "we know we belong to the land," I know that, too. Perhaps it is the prospect of graduating college and moving off in less than a year, but throughout this production I've been struck by the idea of belonging to the land.

I've lived my whole life in this town, but to me, Mayfield will always be synonymous with Purchase Players. This theatre raised me. When I was eight years old I performed in my first show and found my first true passion. When I was in high school, I had a place of refuge when everything seemed bleak. When I directed my first show, I watched in amazement as I saw these kids find a safe haven, a place to explore their talents and find themselves in the process. In this little theatre, I've found a place where I belong.

This production more than any I've been a part of has reminded me what I love about this place. So many people have been involved in presenting this show - from the parents who painted sets to our pit musicians to our brilliant producer to our phenomenal cast, this has been such a team effort. 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
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
